



By Virtue of a Warrt from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing date the Sixth of October Anno<sup>Dom</sup> 1738 I have Survey'd and Laid out unto George Reynolds in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on v<sup>e</sup> West Side Susquehanna River Three hundred & forty three Acres of Land with Allowance of Six P. Cent. Beginning at a Hickery a corn<sup>r</sup> John Tomlinsons land thence South East Three hundred and Forty three Perches to a Black<sup>Oak</sup> Thence North East One hundred and sixty Pchs. to a Post thence North West Ninety Six Perches to a Post North fifty degrees East eight Perches to a Post Thence North forty degrees Westerly Two hundred and thirty one Perches to a Post Thence South fifty Degrees west-erly One hundred and Eighty Nine Perches to the Place of Beginning
