



PURSUANT to a warrant dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of July Anno Domini 1743  
 the above described tract of land was surveyed to Henry Reeser in Bern  
 township in Lancaster County beginning at a white oak a corner of  
 Daniel Heester thence south 60° degrees east by George Reek 126 perches  
 to a post thence north 30 degrees east by same 54 per to a post thence  
 south 60 degrees east by vacant land 60 per to a small hickery thence  
 by 5<sup>th</sup> land the five following courses viz south 30 degrees west 28 per to a  
 black oak thence south 60 degrees east 15 per to a post and south 10  
 degrees west 116 p to a black oak and north 70 degrees west 154 per  
 to a white oak and south 80 degrees west 68 perches to a post in  
 Daniel Heester's line thence north 60 degrees west on D. 37 perches  
 to a hickery thence north 30 degrees east by 5<sup>th</sup> Heester 154 perches  
 to the place of begining containing one hundred and seventy six acres  
 beside the allowance of six p cent ye 3<sup>rd</sup> of October An Dom 1743
