



By virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing date the second day of January Anno Dom. 1737 I have survey'd and laid out unto William McClure in the township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on the west side (obl) Susquehanna River three hundred and ninety nine acres of land with allowance of 6 P. Cent.

Beginning at an Elm Tree by Conecoch (obl) Creek thence south forty two degrees westerly twenty (obl) perches obliterated James Wilsons land then by the sd land south fifty five degrees easterly one hundred and eighty six perches to a Spanish Oak thence south thirty five degrees westerly one hundred and five perches to a black oak thence south seventeen degrees easterly one hundred and thirty nine perches to a black oak thence south fifty five degrees easterly one hundred and twenty two perches to a hickery thence North forty three degrees easterly one hundred and fifty six perches to a hickery near the sd Creek thence up the same traversing the severall courses thereof clear about six hundred perches to the place of beginning.
