Containing two hundred forty seven Acres & twelve perches and allowance of Six per Cent &c. (Being parts of two larger tracts Surveyed ^{on the 13th August 1769} One for Joseph Shippen Junr the other for Edward Shippen Junr on their applications bearing date on the 3rd day of April 1769.

P.S. The part included in the blue lines is the residue of Edward Shippens Survey of 300^{as} which remains to be Patented - & the part included in the red lines is the residue of Joseph Shippen Survey of 298^{as} 118^{ps} that remains to be Patented. the dotted lines show the parts of each survey as patented to Ross & Weiser.

The 247^{as} & 12^{ps} is now owned by One Man who wishes to have both parts included in one Patent which is the cause of said parts being returned together &c.
