Armstrong township 26th April A.D. 1862. Surveyed to Joseph Mc Nutt the above described tract of Land containing eighty seven acres and ten perches and allowance of six per cent. Situate adjoining Lands of Isaac Wachob, Nathaniel Miller and land originally surveyed to William Mc Nutt and others, on the head waters of Blacklegs Creek in Indiana County. By Warrant of the 2nd day of March 1842
