



In pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1902, a survey was made on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of July following for Adam Haverling on a certain Lot of Ground, situate in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumberland and marked in a General plan of the said town Number Two hundred and sixty one, containing in Breadth East and West on Blackberry Street sixty feet, and in length North and South on River Street Two hundred and thirty feet, Bounded Northward by Blackberry Street aforesaid, Eastward by River Street, Southward by Gooseberry Alley, and Westward by Lot Number Two hundred and sixty two. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of June 1904 for Nicholas Miller by Warrant dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> June 1904.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of November, 1905,
