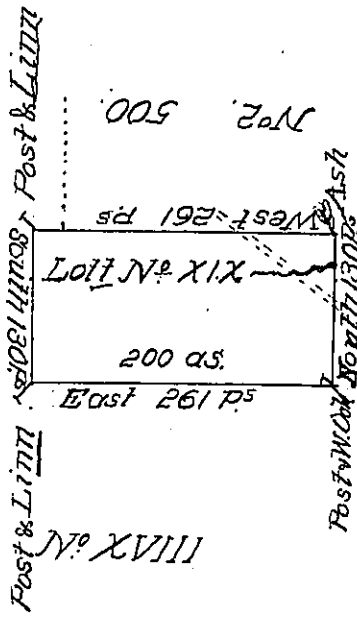


Received of James Trimble a Patent for this Tract of Land to George Wallace in Right of Robert Adams - see old Patent Geo Wallace.

In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> of February 1785, "entitled" An Act for directing the Mode of Distributing the donation lands Promised the Troops of this Commonwealth." And by Order of the Surveyor General with the Approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Supreme Executive Council, I have Surveyed on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October 1785, The Above discribed Tract of Two Hundred Acres of land and Allowance of six P.Cent, for Roads, &c. No XIX. Situate in District No 1. on the West Side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
