



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty-fourth Day of February 1785, intitled, 'An Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised to the Troops by this Commonwealth' and by order of the Surveyor-General, with the approbation of the Honourable the Executive Council, I have surveyed, on the fifth Day of December 1785, the above discribed Tract of Two hundred & Fifty Acres of Land, and allowance of Six Per Cent for Roads, &c. No 123 Situate in District No 6, on the West side of the Allegheny River, in ^{co.} County of Westmorland.
