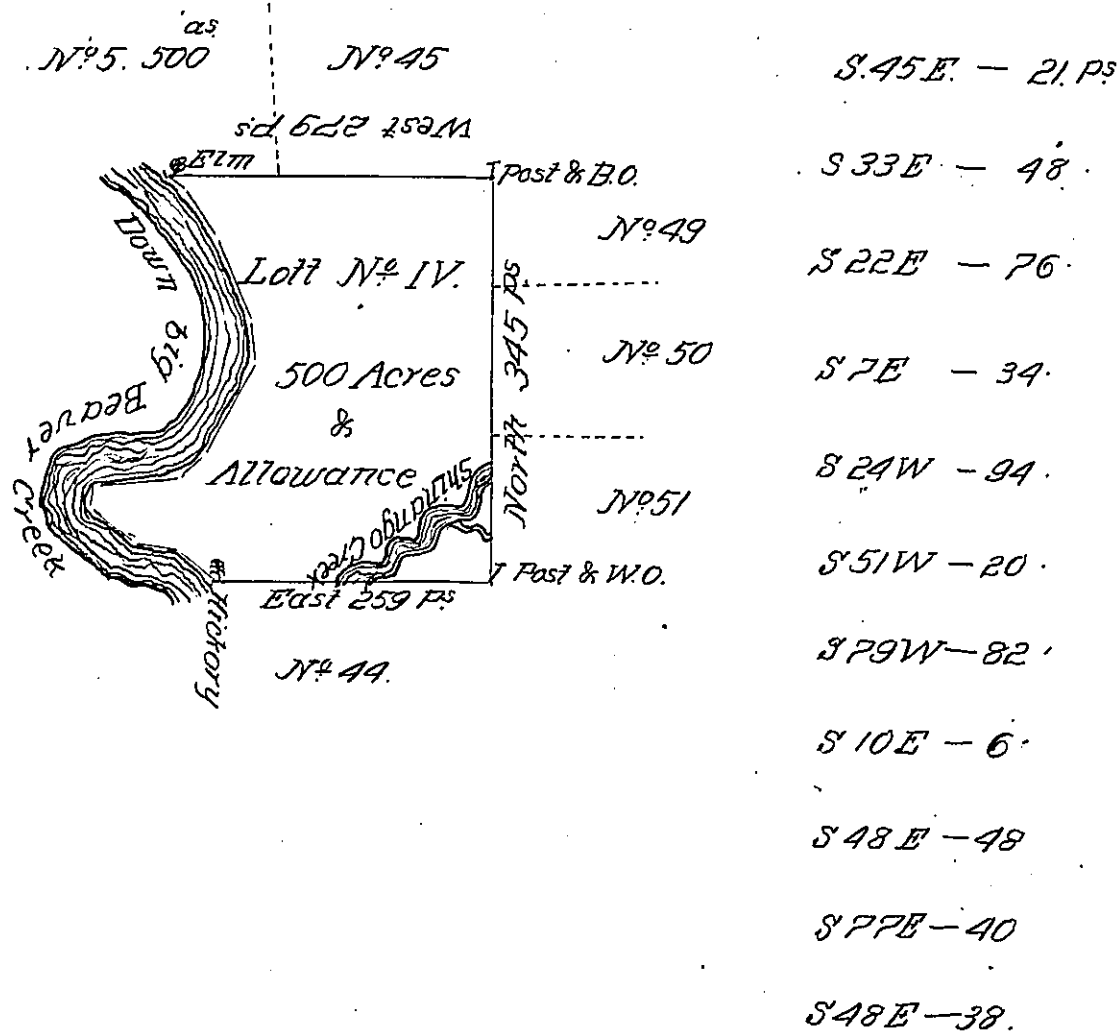


Courses down Beaver Creek.



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania Passed the 24th of February 1785 "entitled" "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation lands Promised to the Troops of this Commonwealth. And by order of the surveyor General with the Approbation of the Honb.^{le} the supreme Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 15th day of October 1785 the Above discribed Tract of Five Hundreded Acres of land, and Allowance of six P. Cent. for Roads &c. No. IV. Situate in District No. I. On the West side of the Allegheny River in the County of Westmoreland.
