



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty fourth Day of February, one thousand seven hundred and eighty five, entitled an Act "for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation Lands, promised to the Troops by this Commonwealth"; and by Order of the Surveyor General, with the Approbation of the Honorable the Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 29<sup>th</sup> Day of September one thousand seven hundred and eighty five, the above discribed Tract of Two hundred Acres of Land, and Allowance for Roads, &c. No. 469 situate in District No. III, on the West Side of the Alleghany River, in the County of Westmoreland.
