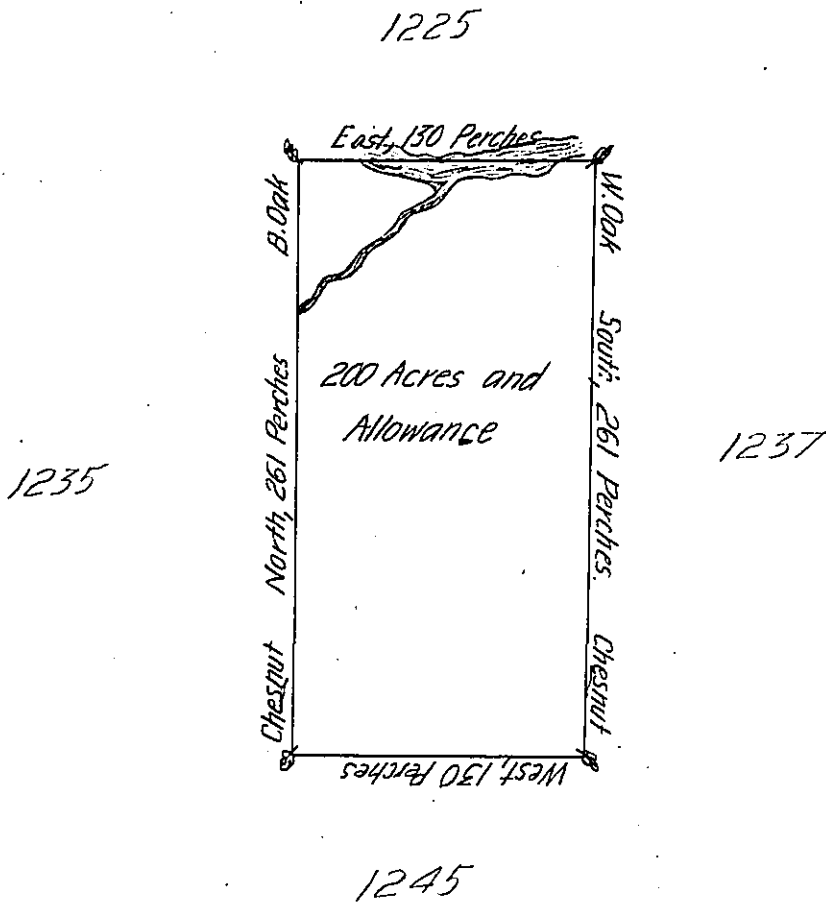


FORM No. 1. DONATION-LAND, in DISTRICT No. 6.

In Pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty-fourth Day of February, 1785, intituled, 'An Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation-Lands promised to the Troops by this Commonwealth,' and by Order of the Surveyor General, with the Approbation of the Honourable the Executive Council, I have surveyed, on the Twenty fourth Day of November 1785, the above described Tract of Two hundred Acres of Land, and Allowance of Six per Cent for Roads, &c. No. 1236 situate in District No. 6, on the West Side of the Allegheny River, in the County of Westmoreland.
