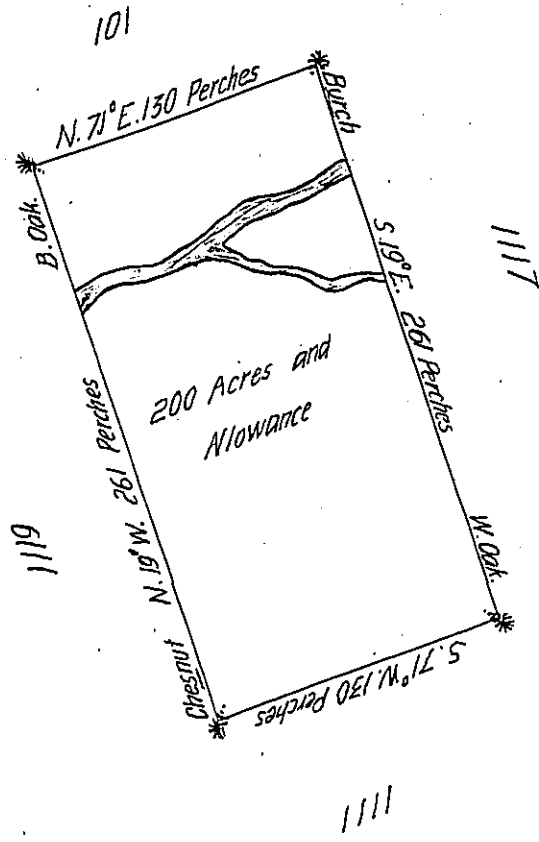


FORM No. 1. DONATION-LAND, in DISTRICT No. 6.

Drawn for the Heirs of James Gordon the 10th Febru. 1812 in Pursu^{ce} of a special Law.



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty-fourth Day of ~~February~~ March 1785, entitled, 'An Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation-Lands promised to the Troops by this Commonwealth,' and by Order of the Surveyor-General, with the Approbation of the Honourable the Executive-Council, I have surveyed, on the seventh Day of November 1785, the above described Tract of Two hundred Acres of Land, and Allowance of Six per Cent for Floods, &c. No. 1118 situate in District No. 6, on the West Side of the Allegheny River, in the County of Westmoreland.
