



By virtue of a Warrant From the Proprietaries Dated
 The Twenty Eighth day of May 1734 Surveyed unto Henry
 Stover a tract of Land Situate on a Branch of Perki-
 ornee—in the County of Philada. Beginning at a black
 Oak in the line of Ulrick Peidlars land thence by the same
 North East fifty perches to a post a corner of sd. Piedlars land
 thence by Vacant Land North West one hundred and thirty
 six perches to a Black Oak Thence by Vacant Land South
 West fifty Perches to a post thence by Vacant Land south
 East one hundred and thirty six perches to the place
 of Beginning Containing forty acres with the usual
 allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent.

Surveyed June 28th 1734.
