



IN PURSUANCE of a Warrant from the Propriet^{rs}, dated the 17th day of May 1736 Survey'd unto William Seymour on the 24th day of the same Month A Certain Tract of Land Situate in Bradford Township in the County of Chester Beginning at a post in a Line of Jonathan Parke's land being a Corner of Jacob Taylor's land thence West by South by the same 126 fches to another post thence North North West by the land of ^{the sd.} Jacob Taylor 158 fches to a post thence East by North by Vacant Land one hundred fches to a Hickery thence South South East along the Barrens 98 fches to a post thence East by North 26 fches to a White Oak thence South South East by the Land of the sd Jonathan Parke 60 fches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred acres & the Customary allowance for Roads & Highways
