



By VIRTUE of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fourteenth day of August 1734 Surveyed unto John Sickfredt a Tract of land Situate in Maxetawny in the County of Philade. Beginning at a Black Oak a Corner of his other land thence by land of ^{Henry} Joest Sansmanhoust South ten degrees East Twenty Seven perches and a half perch to a post thence by vacant land South Eighty degrees West three hundred and ten perches to a small hickery Sapling in a line of Casper Wister's land thence by the same North Ten degrees West twenty seven perches & a half perch to a post thence by the sd. John Sickfredt other Land North Eighty degrees East three hundred and ten perches to the place of Beginning Containing fifty acres with ye usual allowance of six & Cent.
