



Surveyed on the twenty third day of Feb. 1733 to Isaac Starr a Certain tract of Land Situate on a branch of the River Skulkill called Aundenithelea in the County of Philada. Beginning at a hickery a Corner of James Starr's land Standing on the East Side of the Said branch thence South East (061.) hundred and five perches to a post thence <sup>South west</sup> by land of Moses Starr one hundred & fifty perches and the same Course by land laid out for Mary Hockley one hundred Seventy four perches to a learge white oak thence by Vacant land North west one hundred ~~eighty five~~ <sup>eighty one</sup> perches to a post thence by land of Nehemiah Hutton North thirty Two Degrees East One hundred and Sixty perches to a hickery Tree standing on the East Side of the aforeside Branch thence up the Several Courses of the same to the first mentioned or place of Beginning Containing four hundred acres with usual allowance
