



By VIRTUE of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries bearing Date the Eighteenth Day of February Anno Dom 1737 I have Survey'd and Laid out unto Thomas Spray in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the west Side of Susquehanna river Two hundred and nine acres of Land with allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent

Beginning at a Hickery Stand by the side of the sd. river Thence North forty Degrees Westerly One hundred and Seventy One $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a Hickery a Corner of William Moreton's Land Thence South fifty Degrees Westerly one hundred and Ninety four $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a white Oak a Corner of Thomas Fishers Land by the sd. Land One hundred and Eighty five $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a white Oak Thence North fifty Degrees Easterly one hundred and fifty Eight $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a Locust by the said river Thence up the same forty $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to the place of Beginning Survey'd Aprill 11th 1738.
