

Note the whole of the above Survey of George Rife Contains, 424\(\frac{1}{2}\) &c, and appears to have been returned into the Surveyor General\(\frac{1}{2}\) Office by Alexander M. Clean, Esquire. In pursuance of George Rifes Warrant for 400 adated the 10th day of January 1785. But by Virtue of a purchase made by Jacob Lehmer, Junit of a part of the Survey of George Rife, there was Surveyed off to him on the 15th day of April 1811, the quantity of 211/2 & all, which the Said—Lehmer, wishes to Patent exclusive of the other part of George Rife Agreeable to the division line &?

Situate on the waters of Coxes Creek in Millford Township (now) Somerset County and Surveyed as aforesaid at the Instance and request of the Owner, who I expect will forward his title papers with this return.
