



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the eighth day of November 1734 surveyed unto <sup>John</sup> Siever a tract of Land situate in Frederick Township in the County of Philad<sup>ca</sup> Beginning at a white oak a corner of his other land thence by the same North West seventy ~~three~~<sup>eight</sup> perches to a post thence by land of Godlieb Herger North East one hundred and three perches to a post thence by land of Christian Geatzandcanor South East forty six perches to a White oak thence by land of Jacob Hubbaugh South West twenty perches to a post thence by S<sup>d</sup> Hubbaugh's land South East Thirty two perches to a post thence by land of Joseph Groves South West eighty three perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning Containing forty three acres with the usual allowance of six P. Cent.
