



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Third day of September 1734 Surveyed unto Charles Hunter a tract of Land situate on the East side of Schuylkill River in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a Hickery standing on the Bank of said River being a corner of George Clapps land thence by the same North seventy degrees East three hundred & twenty perches to a post thence by Vacant land North twenty degrees West one hundred & four perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South Seventy degrees West three hundred and twenty six perches to a Hickery standing on y<sup>e</sup> Bank of s<sup>d</sup> River thence down the several Courses of the same to the place of Beginning Contain- two hundred acres with the usual allowance of six P. Cent.
