



John Kinneys Land

By virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{able} Proprietaries bearing date the Eight-day of August anno Dom. 1730, I have survey'd and laid out unto Martin-Boogh in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on the West side of Susquehanna River Three Hundred and forty nine acres and Three Quarters of Land with allowance of six P. Cent Beginning at a Hickery a corner of Thomas Browns Land Thence South Ten Degrees Easterly Two Hundred and forty eight Perches to a post, Thence South eighty Degrees Westerly Two hundred and Thirty nine Perches to a post, Thence North Ten Degrees West-erty Two hundred and forty eight Perches to a White Oak, Thence North Eighty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and Thirty nine Perches to the place of Beginning, Survey'd July-1740 P me
