



By virtue of a Warrt. from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing dat. the fifth day of December Anno Dom. 1740. I have surveyd and laid out unto Jacob Snevely in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on the West side Susquehanna river one Hundred and seventy five acres with the allowance of six P. Cent. Beginning at a Black Oak Thence West one Hundred and sixty one perches to a Hickery, Thence South Two Hundred and twelve Perches to a Post, Thence East one Hundred and twenty Perches to a Post Thence North eleven Degrees Easterly Two hundred and sixteen Perches to the place of Beginning, Surveyd Decem<sup>br</sup> 31<sup>st</sup> 1741.
