Dated the 8th of October 1751.

A Draught of a Tract of Land Surveyed to George Swope & Christian Crall 17th April 1747 by G.S— It is Entered in the field Book for the West side Susq^a— I believe there was no Warrant at that Time. Part of the above Tract is Surveyed away by Virtue of a Warrant in the Name of Sam^l. Flower Crall is going down to Contest the time & at his Request have extracted the above D^t from a Copy of the Field Notes
