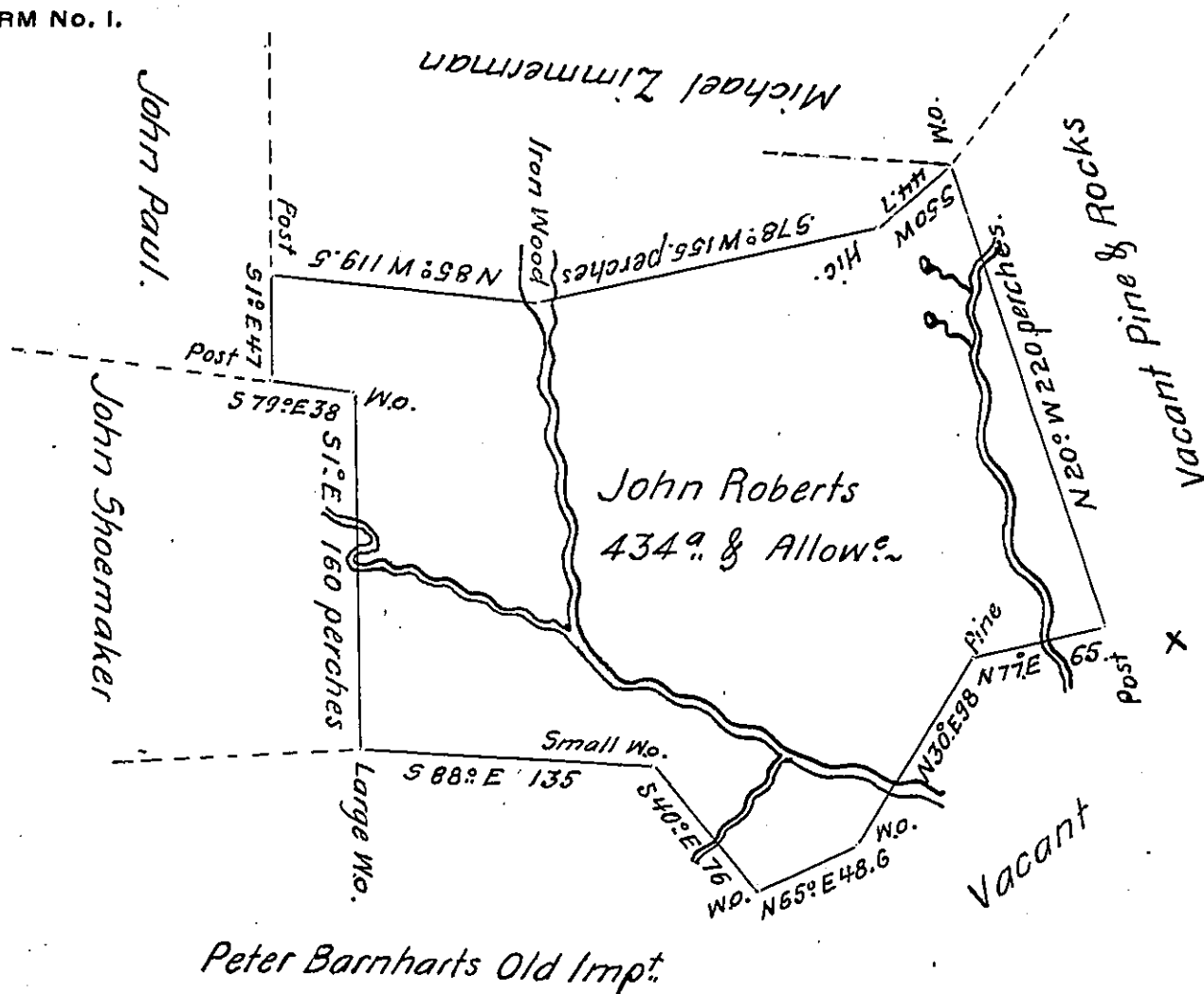


FORM No. 1.



Situated on Higgons's Creek about two Miles South of the Great Road in Quernahoning Township Bedford County and Surveyed the 21st day of August 1786. And Returned into the Surveyor Generals Office in Consequence of a Warrant granted ^{to} ^{dated 6th Sept^r 1784} John Roberts for 300. Acres of Land on Stony Creek about two Miles below the shade Run and North of said Creek and the New Vein of fallen Timber to the East in Quernahoning Township Bedford County. which Right could not be satisfied agreeable to the location thereof by reason of a Prior Survey made on the same by Thomas Smith formerly Deputy Surveyor of Bedford County, as appears by a Certificate on the back of said Warrant under the Hand of George Woods the present Deputy Surveyor of the district in which it was granted. And agreeable to an Act of Assembly in favor of the removal of unsatisfied Rights within the limits of the Old Purchase. ~
