

A Draught of two Tracts of Land Situate in Paradise Township in the County of York Surveyed in Pursuance of Two Warrants one in the Name of Frederick Stover Granted for 30<sup>acres</sup> Dated the 29<sup>th</sup> March 1770. Marked with the Letter A Containing Thirty and one half Acres & Allowance. The Other in the Name of Peter Ickis Dated the 10<sup>th</sup> of March 1789 Containing Forty Six and Three Quarter Acres and allowance. The Line CD. not run, as it adjoins Stovers Patent Land. The Survey of the whole of the Two Tracts above represented was Surveyed on Stovers Warrant; But Ickis's Warrant being out & not Come to hand I knew nothing of it at that Time. Stover Disputes Ickis's Warrant. The above is a True representation of the Matters of Fact as they have Come to my Knowledge
