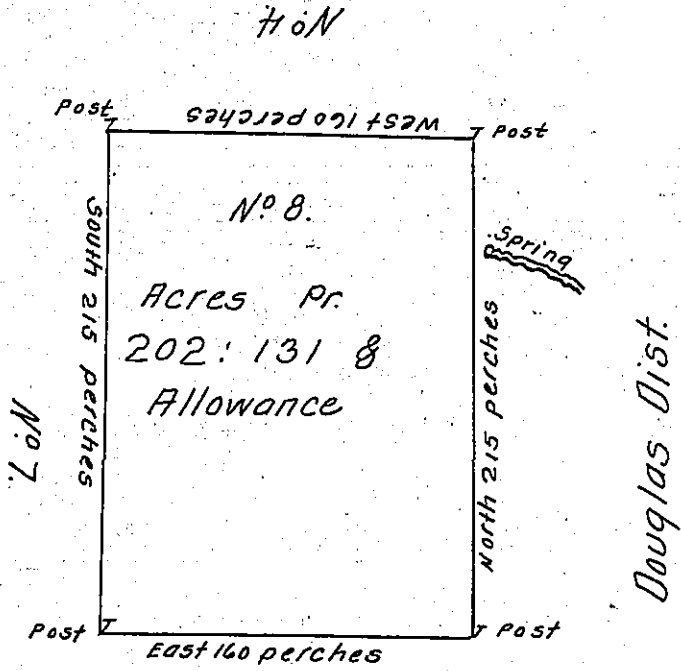

 date at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August 1783. The above tract Containing

 Allowance of Six p<sup>c</sup> Cent for Roads &c. was Surveyed on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of
