



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the tenth day of April A.D. 1793 - granted to Robert Pine - was surveyed on the 17th day of December 1818. The above described tract of land containing 407 acres 87 perches and allowance of six per cent for roads, &c. situated in Sadsbury township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, James Sterling was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of twenty acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, ~~and that the same was divided as above stated, between~~
