



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor

Dated 27th. Day of March Anno Domini 1739 The above Described Tract of Land was Surveyed to Conrod Stickle in Right of John Mayzer in Erle Township in Lancaster County Beginning at a White Oak by Conestogoe Creek Corner of Henry Bowman's Land thence up the Same on the Several Courses thereof 196 per to a post thence N. 60° East by George Wolf's Land 15 perches to his Cor. post thence North 30° West by D^o and Vacant Land 206 perches to a White Oak, thence South 60 Degrees West by Vacant Land 154 perches to a Hickery in the Line of Thomas Henex then South 30 Degrees East 80 perches to a post thence South 60 Degrees West 20 perches to a Spanish Oak thence S. 30 Degrees East by Henry Bowman 80 perches to the p^lce of Beginning Containing Two hund. and Six acres Beside the usual allowance of Six p Cent for Roads.
