



By Virtue of a Warrant of Resurvey dated the 8th. day of November 1763 requiring me to Resurvey and Divide a Certain Tract of Land situate in Paradise Township formerly in the County of Lancaster now in the County of York, Originally Surveyed to Casper Spangler by Warrant dated the 16th. day of October 1738, I do hereby Certify that I have Resurveyed according to the Lines as first Run and Divided the said Tract of Land for Rudolph Spangler the 5th. day of October 1765, as above Discribed; One Moiety or three hundred & fifty six acres thereof for himself. The other Moiety or three hundred and sixty three acres and 154 pers. & allowance, to the said Rudolph: in Trust for the Widow and Children of Jonas Spangler. Containing in the Whole, Seven hundred and Nineteen Acres ^{& 154 pers.} of Land and Allowance of Six acres p Ct. for Roads &c.
