



The Draught of a tract of land situate on Muncy Ridge Spring Township Centre County, Containing four hundred and twelve Acres, one hundred and five perches and allowance of Six per Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 30th. day of April 1813 In pursuance of a warrant granted to John Purdue dated the 26th. day of October 1812.

On the above described premises there is erected a square log dwelling house shingle rufed, a Double barn, a young Orchard, and about fifty Acres of Cleared land under good fence, it was first improved in the year 1805, and the said John Purdue and his family now actuly residing on the same.
