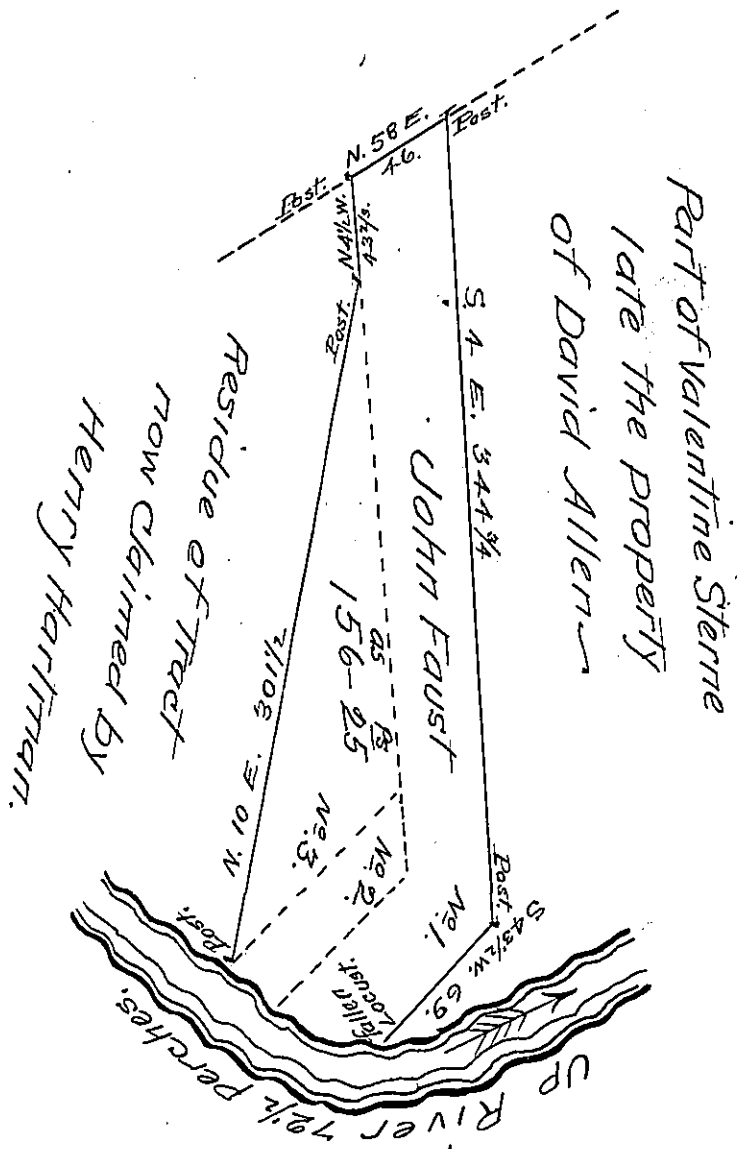

A Draught of one hundred and Fifty six acres and 25 perches and the allowance of Six Per Cent for roads &c. part of a Larger Tract of Land situate in Fermanagh Township (formerly Cumberland) now Mifflin County Surveyd. for Valentine Sterne the 31st Day of August 1761— Said to contain 535 1/4 acres and the allowance of Six Per Cent &c. In pursuance of the Honorable the Proprietaries Warrants one in his own name and one in the name of James Patterson for 150 acres each Dated the 6th Day of February 1755— Note the Dotted Lines thro the above draught shows the manner in which it appears to have been formerly Divided No. 1 and No. 2 is said to have been late the property of John Ranken, the first to contain 100 acres neat measure and the 2^d 14 acres. No. 3 Shews an addition of 50 acres &c. made to said Tract— March 15th 1803. for the use of John Faust who at this time appeard the owner of the other two parts— March 17th 1807 Calculated and laid down all the parts agreeably to their Courses and Distances and find them to contain as aforesaid in the whole One Hundred and Fifty six acres and 25 perches and the allowance &c.
