There is a family lives on the above described land and grain of all kinds has been repeatedly raised thereon. There <sup>is</sup> an Article of agreement wrote in the German Language. Signed the 18<sup>th</sup> February 1776 by George Koch, George Spangler, Johannes Schneider and Johannes Koch to erect a house on the above land for a School house ever since and has been continued for a School house, the Schoolmaster with his family now resides therein, which is all the dwelling house ever erected thereon.
