



The above described tract of land was survey'd [under the direction of W. Cox Ellis, a former deputy Surveyor for this County] on the 15<sup>th</sup> of Aprile 1809, to Jacob Snyder in pursuance of his warrant granted the 28<sup>th</sup> of May 1793. Situate as above described on Whitdeer hole-creek in Washington Township, Lycoming County. Containing One hundred Acres, One hundred and fifty Eight perches and allowance of Six  $\frac{7}{8}$  Ct. And now at the request of said-Snyder examined and approved by me October 30<sup>th</sup> 1813.
