



In pursuance of the actual settlement and residence of Rufus Austin, commencing on, or about the 17th day of August 1818, was surveyed on the first day of June 1832, the above described tract of land, containing 115 acres & 138 perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Situate in Mead township Crawford county (It being part of a larger tract surveyed on the ~~obliterated~~ ~~Deceobliterated~~ said Austin)

The Survey above mentioned of the 4th of December 1818 interfered fifteen perches with the West end of Donation tract No. 1519; and as Mr. Townsend was very desirous of obtaining his title, and the owners of the other parts not prepared to obtain theirs, the first survey has been divided as above. The other parts are believed to be at least equally valuable with this.
