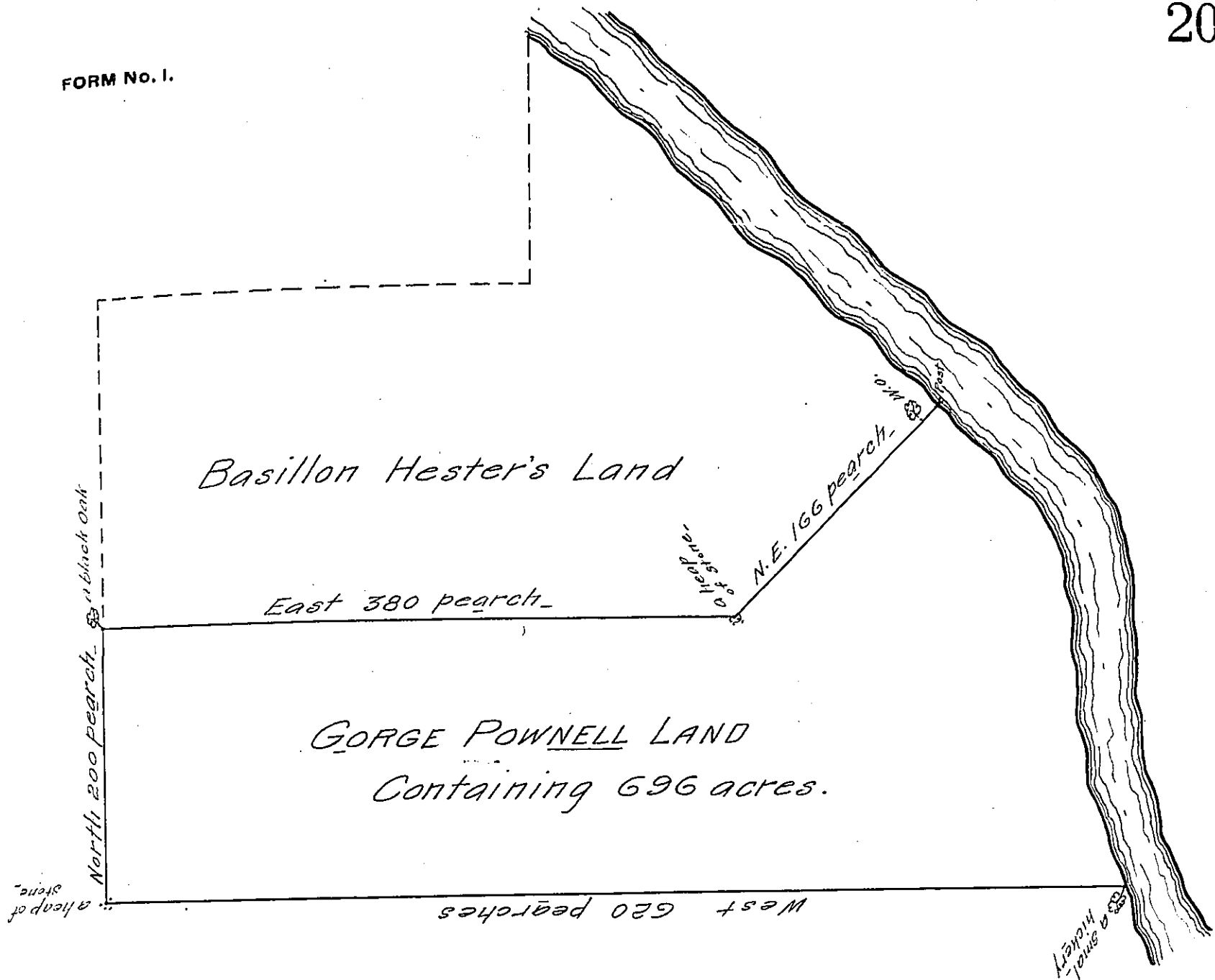

John Chapman d: S.
