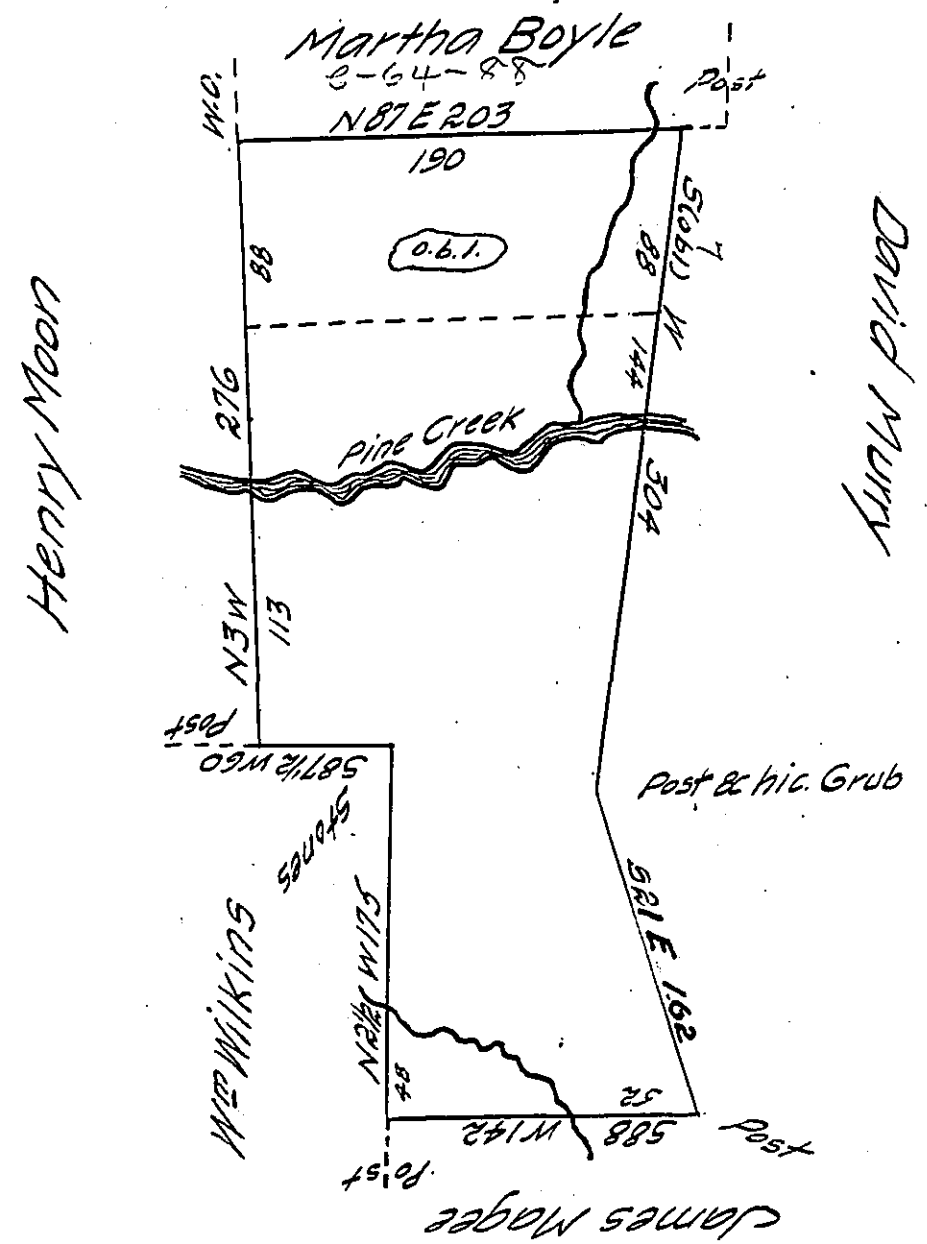

 400 A<sup>s</sup> Situate in Pine Township Alle<sup>y</sup> Co<sup>l</sup>.


