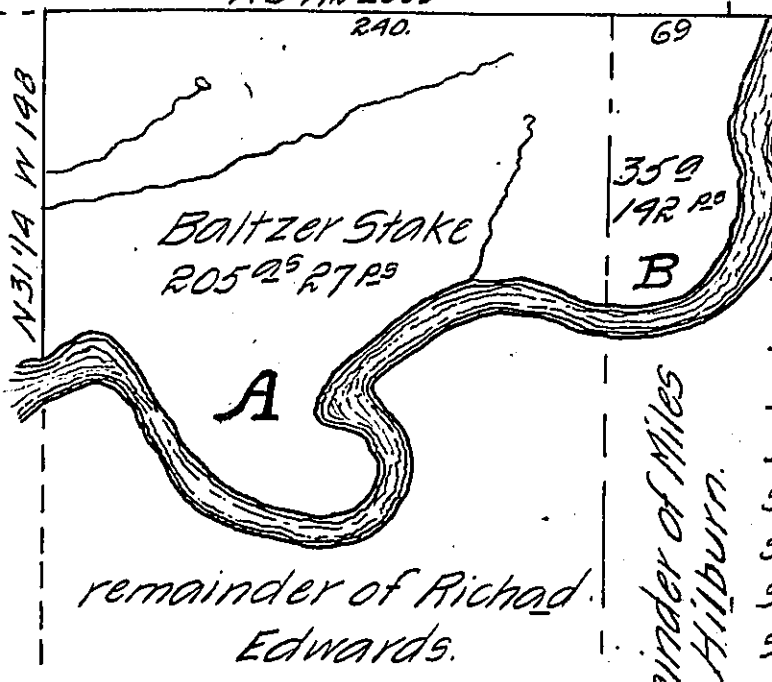

The part marked **B** represents 35²⁵ 142²⁵ originally surveyed on the 30th June 1769 on application N^o 227 granted to Miles Hillburn dated 3^d April 1769 this being the part of the above resited Surveys that lies on the west of Muncy creek.
