



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the tenth day of April 1793 granted to Richard Short. was surveyed on the twelfth day of September 1820 - The above described tract of land containing 484 acres 145 perches and allowance of six percent for roads &c situated in Oil Creek township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, Jonathan Titus -- was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of 20 - acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, ~~and that the same was divided as~~
