



By Virtue of an Application dated the 3<sup>d</sup> of April 1769 N<sup>o</sup> 922 was Surleyed by W<sup>m</sup> Scull then Deputy unto Albert Maxwell the above described Tract of one hundred and fifty six Acres and 5 1/2 perches of Land & Allowance being the Northwestern moiety of the whole Tract which was then Surleyed in pursuance of the said Application and which has been since sold to James Watt; the other above described Moiety of 156 Acres & 15 1/2 perches & Allowance has been since sold as Deeds recited to the said John Tweed above mentioned which said Moiety is situate on the East branch of Warrior Run in Turbut township Northumberland County and has been carefully resurveyed and examined this 4<sup>th</sup> of December 1805.
