Eight Acs. and twenty two perches and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c and the other containing Six hundred and fifty Seven Acres and eighty Six perches and allowance of six per cent in all 1735 acs 108 ps and Six per Cent Allowance Situate on the Waters of Spring Creek in Fridge-way Township in the County of Jefferson, now Elk, and in the last purchase made of the Indians east of the Allegheny River and Conewango Creek. By Virtue of two Warrants granted to the said Nelson Strong, one for 1000 Acres dated January 11<sup>th</sup> 1837 and the other for 600 Acres dated January 13<sup>th</sup> 1837.
