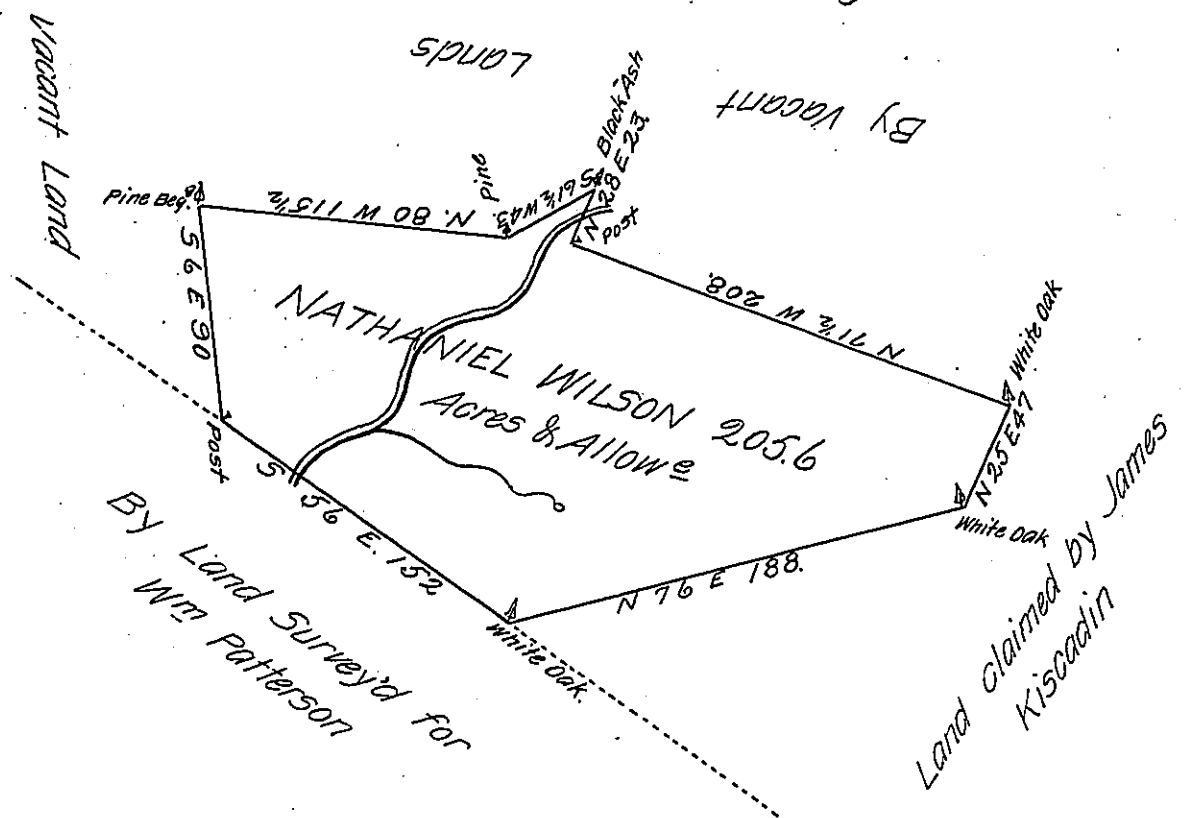

 alledge two Reasons for its being accepted, the ~~the~~ Survey lies in what is now M^r Charles
 Lukens's District and I now have no other Business, in that Quarter and altho it has been
 made near Two Years, I have never heard the least Complaint or insinuation that he had infringed
 the Claim ~~of~~ of any other Person. The Owner says he will patent immediately, the Interest of the
 Proprietaries Might perhaps point out taking his Money with Two years interest and Quit-Rent,
 rather than grant a new Warrant; if Wilson ever was disposed to take another Warrant, which
