



A Draught of One Hundred and thirty seven acres and one quarter of Land and the usual Allowance of Six per Cent Situate (late in Donegal now) in Mountjoy Township in the County of Lancaster. It being part of two Hundred and fifty eight acres & a half of Land, which was Surveyed unto John Semple in pursuance of his Warrent dated the 16th day of May 1744 by Bartram Galbraith late Deputy Surveyor of Lancaster County on the 16th day of December 1780.

I do certify that I have Examined and Calculated the Courses & Distances round the above Draught find the same Correct and the same quantity of acres aforesaid, the Original Survey & Devisien with a Copy of the Warrent deputed remaining in my Office, March 5th. 1805.
