



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the 30th day of August Anno Dom 1739. The above described tract of land was Surveyed unto John Sharp in the township of Hanover, and County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post Thence ^{W. N} West by Thomas Sharp 100 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 68 degrees West by the same 124 perches to a post thence North 36 degrees West by James Finney and John Smith 28 pces. to a Dogg tree - Thence North 52 degrees East by the said Smith 66 perches to a Spanish Oak. Thence North by the same 62 perches to a White Oak. Thence East by North by James Murray 180 perches to Beech on a Small Creek. Thence down the same 46 perches to a White Oak. Thence East by John Graham 12 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 13 degrees West by John Dickson 94 pches to a White Oak. Thence South 70 Degrees West 7 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 20 Degrees East by the said Dickson 18 pchs to ye place of Beginning. Containing One hundred and thirty three acres. Beside the allowance of 6 p Cent.
