



By Virtue of a Warrant bearing date the nineteenth day of November Anno Dom.  
1736. Surveyed unto Conrad Weiser a Certain Tract of Land Situate on  
a Brance of the Great Spring Creek in the County of Lancaster -  
Beginning at a post at a corner of George Haines's Land in a line of  
William Allen's Land. Thence extending by Hains's Land South Sixty Degs  
west One hundred & eight perches to a marked Chestnut Tree, Thence by Vacant  
Land along a Barren Mountain the five Courses & Distances following Viz. North  
Fifty-two degrees west Two hundred & Twenty-two perches to a post North Thirty  
eight Degrees East thirty pches. to a hickery North West Two hundred & six perches  
to a post South Thirty eight Degs West forty pches. to a post and North  
fifty two Degs West Sixty pches. to a post Thence by Vacant - North  
thirty-eight Degs East Ninety five p. to a post in William Allen's Line  
Thence by the same South fifty one Degs East 524 p. to the place of  
Beginning Containing Two hundred & Thirty-four acres & an allow-  
ance of 6 p. c<sup>t</sup> for Roads &c. Surveyed the 21<sup>st</sup> Sept<sup>r</sup> A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>r</sup> 1738.
