



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Twentyeth day of September 1734 Surveyed unto Henry Whitston a tract of Land situate in Maxetawny in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> - Begining at a post a corner of Henry Harpmans land thence by land of Joest Gasmanhoust North Eighty degrees East One hundred & Thirty one perches and by Vacant land the same course Eighty <sup>nine</sup> ~~one~~ perches to a post thence by Vacant land South Ten degrees East One hundred and fifty perches to a Black Oak sapling thence by Vacant land South Eighty degrees West Two hundred and Thirty seven perches to a post in a line of Andreas Fishers land thence by the same North Ten degrees West fifty eight perches to a hickery sapling thence by land of Henry Harman North Eighty deg<sup>s</sup> East Seventeen perches to a Hickery thence by sd Harpmans land North Ten degrees West Ninety <sup>two</sup> ~~three~~ perches to the place of Begining Containing two hundred acres with the usual allowance of Six p Cent.
