



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fourteenth day of March 1733. Surveyed unto Casper Wink a tract of Land situate in Maxatawney adjoining to his other land in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at a Black Oak a Corner of his other land thence by Vacant Land North Ten degrees West Fifty three perches to a small hickery Sapling thence by Vacant Land North Eighty degrees East One hundred and sixty perches to a post Thence by Vacant Land south ten degrees East Fifty three perches to a post thence by his ye^sd Casper's - other Land South Eighty degrees West One hundred and Sixty perches to the place of Beginning Containing Fifty acres with the usual allowance of Six p Cent
