



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing date the third day of November Anno Dom 1739 Surveyed to Moses White a Tract of Land in the Township of Donegal beginning at a Hickory tree in the line of Thomas Wilsons land thence South West by South 113 per To a hickory thence South 100 per to a Black Oak thence North 82 Deg East 110 per to a Black Oak thence North 27 Deg East 275 per to a hickory thence North West 20 per to a white Oak thence South West 90 per to a post standing by the side of Little Sickasalunga Creek thence down the several courses of the 5<sup>d</sup> Creek 105 per to an Ash thence West 5 per to the place of Beginning Containing One hundred & Sixty eight acres of land with the usual allowance of six acres p Cent for roads &c.
