



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Ninth day of September 1734 Surveyed unto John Hays a tract of Land situate in Frederick Township in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Begining at a White Oak Sapling in a line of Paul Hycles land thence by land of Jacob Hubbaugh North West One hundred perches to a post thence by s<sup>d</sup> Hubbaugh's land North East Thirty nine perches to a post Thence by s<sup>d</sup> Hubbaugh's land North West Eighty perches to a Hickery Sapling thence by Vacant land North East One hundred & twenty perches to a post. thence by Vac<sup>t</sup> Land South East One hundred and Eighty perches to a post thence by Vac<sup>t</sup> land South West Seventy one perches and by land of s<sup>d</sup> Paul Hycle Eighty eight perches to the place of Begining. Containing One hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance of Six p<sup>ct</sup> & fifty six perches
