



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Ninth day of September 1734 Surveyed unto John Hays a tract of Land situate in Frederick Township in the County of Philad^a. Begining at a White Oak Sapling in a line of Paul Hyles land thence by land of Jacob Hubbaugh North West One hundred perches to a post thence by s^d Hubbaugh's land North East Thirty nine perches to a post Thence by s^d Hubbaugh's land North West Eighty perches to a Hickery Sapling thence by Vacant land North East One hundred & twenty perches to a post. thence by Vac^t Land South East One hundred and Eighty perches to a post thence by Vac^t land South West Seventy one perches and by land of s^d Paul Hyle Eighty eight perches to the place of Begining. Containing One hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance of Six p^{ct} & fifty six perches
