



By Virtue of the Warrants from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing date respectively on the ^{Eighth} ~~first~~ day of June anno Dom. 1738 and the twenty fifth of June Anno Dom. 1740. I have surveyed and Laid out unto William Wyerman on Burmudian Creek in the County of Lancaster on the West side Susquehanna river Eight hundred and Ninety nine acres of Land with allow. of Six p. Cent. Beginning at a post thence South Fifty eight degrees Easterly fifty four pches. Thence South Twenty two degrees Easterly Forty six pches to a White Oak. Thence South Thirty two Degrees Westerly forty pches to a Hickery Thence South Twenty two degees Easterly Two hundred and Eighty two pches to a post. Thence South Thirty two degrees Westerly Three hundred fifty three— to a post North fifty eight degrees Westerly Three hundred and twenty pches to a double Hickery Thence North Thirty two degrees Easterly Five hundred Eighty five pches to the place of Beginning
